Look at the learning intention and success criteria!

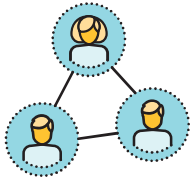
## Ask...

## **Build success criteria.**

What would you need to be able to do as proof or evidence that you mastered the learning intention(s)? Come up with two to four success criteria:

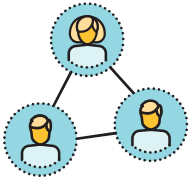
